



### **Register Trend**








### **Maintaining Registration**

- An annual fee will be payable each year on the anniversary of date of registration
- Reminder emails will be sent in advance of payment date
- Payments can be made via online account or by telephone
- Registrants will 'renew' their registration at year 3 or at year 5
  - This requires a short renewal form to be submitted with accompanying annual fee
- Registrants removed for non-payment/renewal will receive a RE-reg link to be restored to the Register in their notification of removal


