

Notice of Decision

This is a notice of decision of the Northern Ireland Social Care Council (the Council).

Decision

The Council has decided:

- 1. that there is evidence that your Fitness to Practise is impaired by reason of misconduct, as defined in Part 1, Rule 4 of the NISCC Fitness to Practise Rules 2019.
- 2. to issue a warning and direct that a record of the warning should be placed on your entry in the Register for a period of four years.

MISCONDUCT

That whilst being registered as a social care worker, and whilst employed as a Domiciliary Care Worker at the Southern Health and Social Care Trust (SHSCT):

- a. Between May 2020 and November 2021, on 32 occasions you claimed for and received payment for 1595.8 miles for journeys not undertaken;
- b. Between January 2020 and December 2021, on 17 occasions you overinflated mileage claims, receiving payment for 1852.2 miles not travelled. These amounted to the sum of approximately £1927.52.

Reasons

The reasons that this behaviour is considered to constitute impaired fitness to practise are:

- Your actions were dishonest.
- Your actions occurred on multiple occasions over a prolonged period of approximately 2 years.
- Your behaviour has fallen below the standard expected of a person registered with the Northern Ireland Social Care Council.

NISCC Standards of Conduct and Practice for Social Care Workers

The Standards of Conduct and Practice for Social Care Workers that your behaviour has breached, are as follows:

Standard 2: As a social care worker, you must strive to establish and maintain the trust and confidence of service users and carers. This includes:

- 2.1 Being honest and trustworthy;
- 2.6 Being reliable and dependable;
- 2.11 Not engaging in practices which are fraudulent in respect of use of public or private monies.

Standard 5: As a social care worker, you must uphold public trust and confidence in social care services. In particular you must not:

5.8 Behave in a way, in work or outside work, which would call into question your suitability to work in social care services;

Sanction

Having regard to the document 'Consensual Disposal Indicative Sanctions' the Council decided that the appropriate sanction was the imposition of a warning on your registration for a period of four years.

Reasons for the Sanction

When reaching its decision the Council considered the following factors:

- Your actions occurred on multiple occasions over a prolonged period of approximately 2 years.
- You claimed for and were paid for 32 journeys you did not undertake and you overinflated 17 mileage claims, receiving payment for 1852.2 miles not travelled.
- Your actions were dishonest.
- You are unable to provide an explanation for the inaccuracies in your mileage claims.
- Your actions have the potential to bring the profession into disrepute.
- Your behaviour has demonstrated a serious disregard for the NISCC Standards of Conduct and Practice.
- You have repaid the money to the Trust.
- You have engaged with the Council.
- You do not deny the inaccuracies and have provided a limited account of your actions to the Council.
- You have no previous record of misconduct with the Council.
- You have apologised to the Trust and the Council for your actions and accept responsibility for your actions.

Consent

Having been advised of the consequences, and having been recommended to take independent advice, you consented to the imposition of a warning on 3rd July 2023. A record of the warning has been placed on your entry in the Register for a period of four years and does not affect your ability to practise.

Date of Effect

This warning comes into effect on 4th July 2023.
