

Notice of Decision

This is a notice of decision of the Northern Ireland Social Care Council (the Council).

Decision

The Council has decided:

1. that there is evidence that your Fitness to Practise is impaired by reason of misconduct, as defined in Part 1, Rule 4 of the NISCC Fitness to Practise Rules 2019.
2. to issue a warning and direct that a record of the warning should be placed on your entry in the Register for a period of three years.

Misconduct

That whilst being registered as a social care worker, and whilst employed as a Support Worker at MPA Recruitment you:

- a. submitted fraudulent timesheets for payment for shifts not worked on 12.8.22; 27.8.22; 3.9.22; 26.9.22; 29.9.22; 30.9.22; 6.11.22 and 27.11.22 for your own financial gain to the sum of £1033.50.

Reasons

The reasons that this behaviour is considered to constitute impaired fitness to practise are:

- Your actions were dishonest;
- Your actions were fraudulent in respect of claiming monies for shifts not worked;
- You exploited a colleague by forging their signature on timesheets;
- Your behaviour has fallen below the standard expected of a person registered with the Northern Ireland Social Care Council.

NISCC Standards of Conduct and Practice for Social Care Workers

The Standards of Conduct and Practice for Social Care Workers that your behaviour has breached, are as follows:

Standard 2: As a social care worker, you must strive to establish and maintain the trust and confidence of service users and carers. This includes:

- 2.1 Being honest and trustworthy;

2.11 Not engaging in practices which are fraudulent in respect of use of public or private monies.

Standard 5: As a social care worker, you must uphold public trust and confidence in social care services. In particular you must not:

5.2 Exploit service users, carers or colleagues in any way;

5.8 Behave in a way, in work or outside work, which would call into question your suitability to work in social care services;

Sanction

Having regard to the document '*Consensual Disposal Indicative Sanctions*' the Council decided that the appropriate sanction was the imposition of a warning on your registration for a period of three years.

Reasons for the Sanction

When reaching its decision the Council considered the following factors:

- You claimed for and accepted payment for work you knowingly did not complete.
- Your actions were dishonest.
- Your behaviour was not an isolated incident but occurred on at least 8 occasions;
- Your behaviour has demonstrated a serious disregard for the NISCC Standards of Conduct and Practice.

The following mitigating circumstances were taken into account in reaching this decision:


- You have engaged in a timely manner and made full admissions to both your employer and the Council and expressed remorse for your actions.
- There is no evidence of direct or indirect harm to service users.
- You have repaid the money to MPA Recruitment.
- You have no previous record of misconduct with the Council.
- You were experiencing financial, personal and health difficulties at the time.

Consent

Having been advised of the consequences, and having been recommended to take independent advice, you consented to the imposition of a warning on 9 August 2023. A record of the warning has been placed on your entry in the Register for a period of three years and does not affect your ability to practise.

Date of Effect

This warning comes into effect on 10 August 2023.
