Therapeutic Model of Practice in Residential Childcare



Introduced in the Western Health and Social Care Trust (WHSCT)



Only homegrown Model of the five therapeutic practice models introduced in Northern Ireland



Fundamental objective of Model to connect with children/young people in a more positive, productive way





Aims of the Research



To gauge residential childcare staffs understanding of MAP and its core concepts



Did it make a difference to the practice within residential children's homes in the WHSCT?



Did it improve relationships within residential childcare teams?



Did it help in promoting positive outcomes for the children and young people in the sector?



Research Design



Mixed methods approach (questionnaires/ Semi structured interviews)



86 questionnaires sent out (all residential care staff)



36 returned (42% return)



15 semi structured interviews



42% of staff returned questionnaires



17% of entire residential care staff group
