5	Adult Protection Bill	
5.1	Fiona Rowan, Professional Social Work Officer: Department of Health attended the meeting to provide an overview of the Adult Protection Bill.

6.	Group Discussions	
	Following the presentation from Fiona members spilt into working groups to consider the Strengths, Opportunities and Aspirations from the Adult Protection Bill.	
	 Strengths: Adult Safeguarding and Protection training is already provided within the PIP Framework. A lot of people are already trained Interdisciplinary learning and working together. There has been a lot of work done, a lot of ground covered, will take a long time to implement, which means there is time to align with PIP Agility of PiP Framework to respond to different levels of training – WBLR. 	
	 Opportunities: Could develop research opportunities for evidence-based interventions. Target training to where it is needed, and using different parts of the framework (Work based learning route). Parity with Children's Social Workers. Map adult safeguarding with children's safeguarding. Ensure that APSW (Adult Protection Social Work) training is incorporated into PIP Framework – Recognised Professional Qualification. Renumeration for staff taking on more complex role and more responsibility, with protection work. Look at systemic issues and societal problems. Issues around coercion in relationships and influence of social media, ethics, values and practice dilemmas. Whole sector approach to meet the needs of whole region, 	
	consistency.	

	 Aspirations: Promote the responsibility of all employers to adequately train staff. Regionally agreed training – accessible to all sectors and coproduced, co-facilitated. Focus on prevention and early intervention and resources behind this. Focus on community and person-centred work. Work based learning route Programme – Flexibility to respond to issues emerging at a specialist level and targeted modules / parts of programme for specific roles. Hybrid approach to teaching. Academic and work-based assessment. Challenges Is the APSW the correct title? Multi Agency Focus Finance Assessment Interface with Duty of Candour
