Why be a Social Worker?

- Make a real and positive difference in the lives of children, young people, adults and older people.
- A Degree in Social Work gives you lots of choices. There are many different jobs, from child and family social work across all ages to criminal justice depending on which groups of people you want to work with. You will promote social justice in health and social care settings, in education, criminal justice and the voluntary sector.
- You will have a potential starting salary of between £25-30K, and there are good opportunities for promotion early-on in your career.
- You will be supported in practice and throughout your career with continuous personal and professional development opportunities.
- A financial incentive is available to students living and studying in Northern Ireland. Students are entitled to apply for a payment of £4,500 for each year of the Social Work degree.
