

## **Notice of Decision**

This is a notice of decision of the Northern Ireland Social Care Council (the Council).

## Decision

The Council has decided:

- 1. that there is sufficient evidence to conclude that there is a realistic prospect that your Fitness to Practise is impaired by reason of misconduct, as defined in Part 1, Rule 4 of the NISCC Fitness to Practise (Amendment) Rules 2019.
- 2. to issue a warning and direct that a record of the warning should be placed on your entry in the Register for a period of 3 years.

# Misconduct

That whilst being registered as a social care worker, and whilst employed by Malone Healthcare Ltd as a Senior care Assistant:

- 1. On the 26 August 2024, you took cocodomol 30/500mgx186, diazepam 2mg x 9 and mirtazapine 15mg x 10 from your workplace without permission, resulting in you being issued with a Community Resolution Notice by the Police Service of Northern Ireland.
- 2. Your actions at 1 above, were dishonest.

#### Reasons

The reasons that this behaviour is considered to constitute impaired fitness to practise are:

- As a social care worker, you must uphold public trust and confidence in social care services, this includes being honest and trustworthy. By taking medication without permission you acted in a manner that was not honest and trustworthy.
- Your behaviour has fallen below the standard expected of a person registered with the Northern Ireland Social Care Council

## **NISCC Standards of Conduct and Practice for Social Care Workers**

The Standards of Conduct and Practice for Social Care Workers that your behaviour has breached, are as follows:

**Standard 2**: As a social care worker, you must strive to establish and maintain the trust and confidence of service users and carers. This includes:

**2.1** Being honest and trustworthy

**Standard 5:** As a social care worker, you must uphold public trust and confidence in social care services. In particular you must not:

**5.8** Behave in a way, in work or outside work, which would call in to question your suitability to work in social care services.

## Sanction

Having regard to the document 'Consensual Disposal Indicative Sanctions' the Council decided that the appropriate sanction was the imposition of a warning on your registration for a period of 3 years.

#### Reasons for the Sanction

When reaching it's decision the Council considered the following factors:

- Your actions had the potential to bring the profession into disrepute.
- Your behaviour has demonstrated a serious disregard for the NISCC Standards of Conduct and Practice.
- Your actions were dishonest.
- You took medication without permission from your workplace.
- You accepted a Community Resolution Notice from the PSNI related to this matter.
- You did not inform your new employer of the disciplinary proceedings related to this matter in a timely manner.

The following mitigating circumstances were taken into account in reaching this decision:

- All medication was recovered.
- There was no evidence of direct or indirect harm to service users.
- You have engaged with the Council and demonstrated some insight, reflection and learning, including complying with interim conditions which were placed on your registration.
- You are currently employed, have provided regular reports regarding your practice and there
  have been no further concerns regarding your conduct or practice.
- You have no previous record of misconduct with the Council.

#### Consent

Having been advised of the consequences, and having been recommended to take independent advice, you consented to the imposition of a warning on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2025. A record of the warning has been placed on your entry in the Register for a period of 3 years and does not affect your ability to practise.

## **Date of Effect**

This warning comes into effect on 11 December 2025.
